LINGARAJ COLLEGE, BELAGAVI

Under Graduate Programmes (B.A., B.COM. & BBA) Under New Education Policy

Programmes Information

- These programmes are under autonomous system affiliated to Rani Channamma University Belagavi.
- The B.A degree enables the students to make an in-depth study of social sciences and develop language proficiency.
- The B.Com degree trains the students in all aspects of business endeavors.
- The BBA degree trains the students in gaining an insight into business studies.
- The degrees have a strong emphasis on theory and practice.
- The aim of these degrees is to impart knowledge and skills to the students.

Eligibility for Admission

 A candidate who has passed the Two Year Pre University Courses (10+2) of the Pre-University Board in the State of Karnataka or H.S.Sc/ CBSE/ ICSE or any other course considered as equivalent is eligible for admission to B.A/ B.Com/ BBA programme. Students, who pass 10+2 examination from other Boards, shall produce Eligibility Certificate from the Registrar, Rani Channamma University, Belagavi.

Admission Policy and Procedure

Admission shall be made according to the reservation policy of Government of Karnataka and the existing rules of admission of Rani Channamma University, Belagavi.

The following original certificates should be produced at the time of admission.

- PUC II year marks card.
- The candidate who has passed the 10+2 examination from the Boards other than the Pre-University Board of Karnataka, should produce Eligibility Certificate from Registrar, Rani Channamma University, Belagavi.
- Three passport size photographs.
- Community certificate in original and two photo copies attested by Gazetted Officer.
- * Detailed Admission policy is available on College Website.

DURATION OF PROGRAM

- Three or four academic years as per the choice of the student consisting of six or eight semesters.
- Two semesters in each academic year.
- Each semester consists of 16 weeks of instructional work.
- The candidate shall complete his/her degree within six or eight years from the date of admission to the first semester of Degree Program.

Library: The Library with rich, varied and rare collection of 101391 books on its shelves in a veritable 'Treasure House' for the scholars, teachers and students. Containing the boundless ocean of knowledge in its bosom on library is nourishing the aspirations of the lovers of knowledge. Constant updating of the books is done in tune with the changing needs. In that direction, the library is fully automated with a provision for free Internet usage and institutional membership access to N-LIST of INFLIBNET, DELNET and British Council Library, Bengaluru in the Digital Library and KIOSK for Online Public Access Cataloguing (OPAC). The Poor Students Lending Library (PSLL) provides books to the poor and deserving students for the entire year. The reading room attached to the library provides Magazines and Newspapers for general reading purpose apart from large number of National and International journals (print and e-Journals). An exclusive Competitive Examinations Reference Section is set up for the benefit of students. The library is kept open on all working days from 10 am to 6 pm. The department of BBA has an independent library. The Library has more than 8263 books on its shelves and over 38 periodicals on its desk.

Gymkhana and Sports: The gymkhana department of the college provides the best facilities in the field of sports and games. The college has 400 mts. Cinder track of International Standards. It has all necessary infrastructure facilities for athletics/sports events like Cricket, Football, Basket Ball, Hockey, Volley Ball, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho and Swimming Pool. The Gymkhana provides the multi trainer, weight lifting set, wooden floor shuttle badminton court, Table Tennis and facilities for other indoor games. The department is supervised by a highly qualified and experienced Physical Education Director.





The College has exclusive Computer Laboratories for Arts, Commerce and BBA students. The Practical for B.Com., BBA classes and training in computers for Arts students are carried in the Computer Lab.

Ladies Room: The Ladies Room caters to all the requirements of the lady students of the college besides providing them privacy and security. The purified cool drinking water and separate lunch room is the unique features of the ladies room.

KLE's Lingaraj College Institution's Innovation Council established in the year 2019. The initiative was to create a vibrant local innovation ecosystem, start-up supporting mechanism, establish function ecosystem for scouting ideas and pre-incubation of ideas and to develop better rational ability for students from the different streams such as Arts, Commerce and Business Administration.
